

Hello Junior Camper!!

We are so excited that you'll be at camp **June 18-22!** We are going to have so much fun!

We're gonna be going Beyond Belief: The Universe of God. **We'll learn about Christ & God, we'll swim, do crafts, eat camp food, and make awesome new friends!**

- Make sure to **bring a water bottle**, something easy to carry around with you. It will be hot and we want you to stay hydrated!
- Each camper will get a camp shirt but we ask that you **bring a plain white cotton blend shirt (new or used)** for tie dye! You'll get to take home a not so white shirt at the end of camp!
- Attached you will find a complete list of what to bring to camp and some things NOT to bring to camp.

Camp starts Monday, June 18 at 2pm.

Camp ends with worship at the outdoor worship center at 11:15am on June 22.

Parents! It is very important that you arrive on time, but please do not arrive before 2pm. As a camp staff, we have lots to do before camp starts and will be working right up until 2pm. **We won't be ready to check anyone in until 2pm, camp activities will not begin until 3:30pm.** Check in will be to the right, past the pond at the large pavilion. We will have signs. **Do not unload your vehicle until you arrive at the cabin your child will be staying in.** That information will be given to you at check in. Bring the email you received from the region after you registered for easy and quick registration!

If you have **medicine** that you take daily, bring it in a Zip Lock bag with your name on it and when you are supposed to take it. **All medicine will be kept with the camp nurse and dispensed when needed. Have your medicine ready to turn over to the camp nurse at check in time!** (Inhalers and other exceptions will be made.) You may bring money for offering on Friday and \$1 a day for snacks at the waterfront.

Are you excited? We hope so! We know that this is a lot of information so if you or your parents have questions, please call us at the numbers below. Our cell phones will also serve as emergency numbers during camp. Know that we are praying for you and that we have been praying for our camp for a very long time. We can't wait to finally meet you!

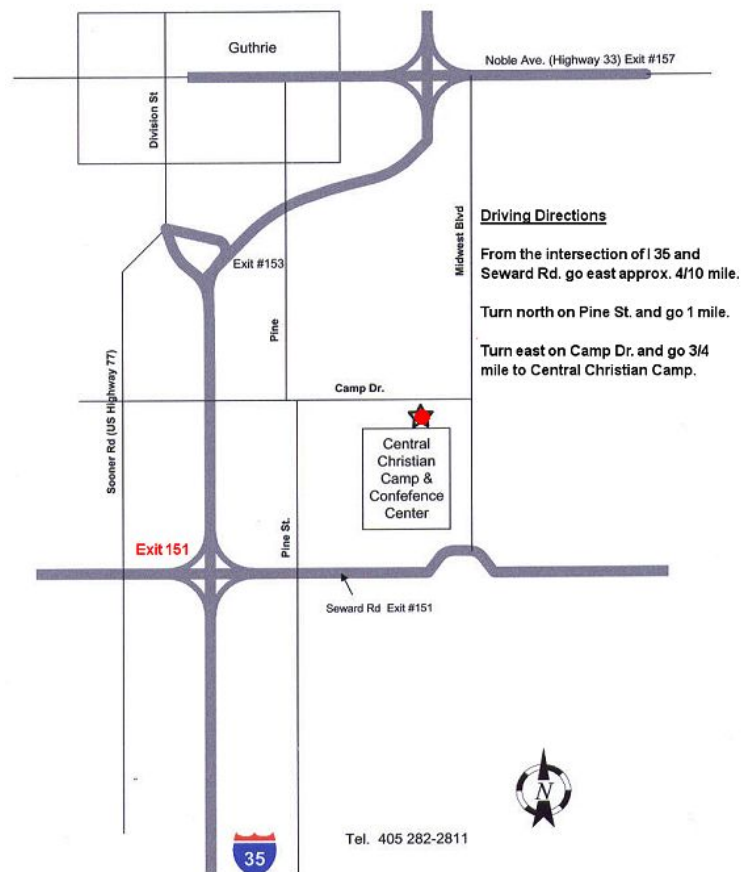
In addition to the what to bring to CAMP list we want to stress these things...

- o **CLOSE TOED SHOES ((OPEN TOED SHOES... flip flops are only allowed in the shower. Swim shoes or toe covered sandals are recommended for pool time. We don't want creepy crawly's playing with your toes! And we do a lot of walking.))**
- o Money for offering & \$1 a day for snacks at the waterfront
- o Any medications that are prescribed by your Dr. (these meds must be listed on your registration form, and placed in a zip lock bag to be given to the camp nurse)
- o **Drinking cup or bottle**
- o White t-shirt (new or used but it won't come back the same!)

Please do not bring...

- o Please don't bring your cell phone or gaming device! Bring a book for down time or a game for your cabin to play but no electronic devices.
- o Junk food- mice just love when campers bring them snacks.... so don't! We will have plenty for you to eat!
- o Elephants - unless they are stuffed... then it's okay.

Packing for Camp

Suggested Packing List

- Pillow, sheets blanket or bed roll (bunks have mattresses)
- Extra pair of shoes
- Pair of socks per day
- Change of clothes per day (shorts, jeans, T-shirts, dress up clothes not needed)
- Change of under garments per day
- Closed Toe Shoes
- Light jacket
- Hat (optional)
- Camera
- Swimsuit: Intentional Christian community requires persons to think of others as we make choices. Your young person may be comfortable in a speedo, or revealing swimsuit at the pool or waterfront, but others may be uncomfortable with that attire. Please consider modesty when packing appropriate swimwear for camp.

- Rainy-day clothing
- Tissues or handkerchiefs
- Bath towel (no more than 2)
- Beach Towel or Swimming Towel (1)
- Personal Toiletries (soap in a container, shampoo, toothpaste, brush, etc.)
- Insect repellent & Sunscreen
- Robe and pajamas (showers and toilets may be a short walk from the cabin)
- Smiles (camp is no place for crabby people)
- Flashlight
- Bible
- Drinking Cup / Water Bottle
- Letters-to-home kit (paper, envelopes, pen and stamps)
- Money: Some camps offer Canteen (cokes, fruit drinks and candy bars are sold). Some camps receive an offering to help with a mission project.

Leave at Home

- Consider camp as a short “digital sabbatical.” **Digital connections have become a distraction at our camp experiences.** Church camp experiences are meant to be time away. Parents, if your child or youth are homesick or having difficulties at camp, one of the camp directors will contact you to help resolve the situation. We understand that many use their phone as an alarm clock. Our adult volunteers will make sure campers are awake with plenty of time to prepare for the day each morning.

- **We ask that Junior and Discovery Campers leave phones at home.**

- **Cell Phone Policy for Chi Rho Campers and CYF Campers:** Campers will have thirty minutes to an hour each day, Tuesday-Thursday, during free time to access their phones. Phones will be collected on Monday at check in. If a camper holds on to their phone, that camper will be sent home. The collection on Monday is your only warning. We want campers to be present at camp as much as possible, but also understand the realities of technology in your lives. Thank you for your cooperation and adherence to this new policy.

Directors will lock phones in a safe place for the week and return them at the end of camp.

- Computers or Tablets
- Electronics (hand held gaming systems)
- Fireworks
- Prescription Drugs: Unless listed on registration form and Director is informed.
- Illegal Substances, Alcohol, or Tobacco, Smokeless Tobacco. All camps are tobacco free zones.
- E-Cigarettes / Vapor Cigarettes
- Knives or Weapons of any kind are against camp regulations and you will be sent home at your own expense if you have them in your possession.
- Pets
- Expensive Jewelry
- Junk Food (including candy)
- Large Sums of Money

Directors may have other requests for what to bring/not bring items that will be listed in the camper letter.
